

Answer: If an opening becomes available then there is a possibility of becoming a member. Thirty years ago when Bandanna Ranch was formed a generous section of acreage (about 37000 acres) was set aside for a private hunting area exclusive to Bandanna Ranch landowners. Since then, the original developers of Bandanna Ranch sold off all but 6,000 of the hunting land to other developers. The hunting area has been reduced to such a small area that it only supports 30 members of the hunt club. These members must be Bandanna Ranch lot owners and pay an additional fee to the hunt club. There is a waiting list if someone drops out of the hunt club new members can apply. You can contact the president of the hunt club, Vern Frazier for more information. The hunt club area is gated off down near the airport, and the area is patrolled for trespass violators. All other locked gates within Bandanna Ranch are protecting the private property of Southern Cross which is also patrolled.

The Hunt Club has a target shooting practice range set up in Grass Hollow that is available for use by Bandanna Ranchers and their guests as long as they take care of the area and do not leave trash or go around a locked gate. If the gate is locked, the area is closed for a good reason (i. e. high fire danger, hunting season, or game migration season). The range can be accessed by taking Airport (of of Bandanna Drive) and taking the road that forks off at the Horse Barn.

ABSOLUTELY NO SHOOTING WITHIN THE SUBDIVISION or the Sherriff will be knocking on your door. The practice range is the only place where it is allowed to discharge a gun.
